## A Message from the Black In Neuro Team

In July 2020, our president, Angeline Dukes, sent out a Tweet: "Sooo, when are we doing Black In Neuro Week?" Following the lead of #BlackBirdersWeek, #BlackInAstroWeek and #BlackBotanistsWeek, and walking in the footsteps of online advocacy initiatives like Vanguard STEM and BLACKandSTEM, we set out to celebrate Black scholars in neuroscience-related fields the week of July 27th to August 2nd, 2020. We could not have imagined what would happen next.

Over the next year, what started as a week-long, online campaign grew into an international organization, whose impacts extended beyond the virtual space. Together, we built a community, amplified researchers on the job market, shared our science despite cancelled conferences, grieved losses and celebrated successes, put pressure on our institutions to change, and showed the world that Black scholars researching and treating the nervous system belong here.

We could not be more grateful to you, our Black In Neuro community, our allies and our sponsors, for the platform you have helped create. You showed up, participated, learned, unlearned, backed your words with concrete actions, and put your money where your mouth is.



Over 2,000 attendees joined Black In Neuro events from 61 countries and participants reported speaking 13 different primary languages.


